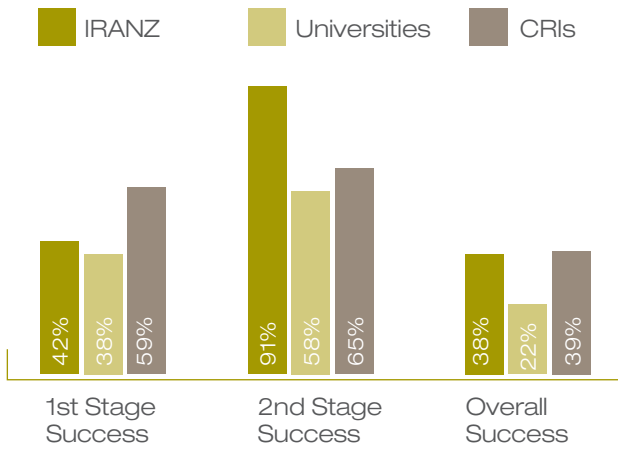
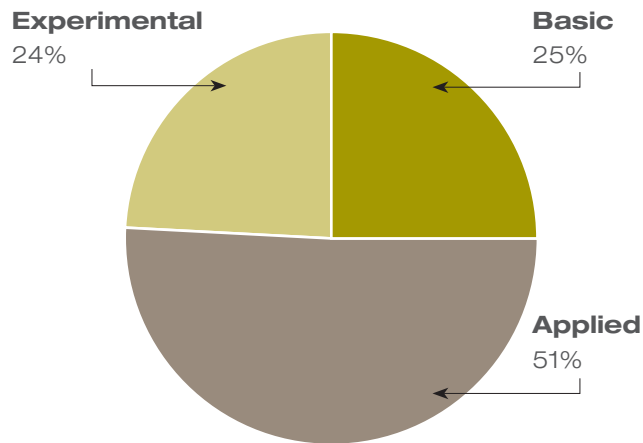


FRST Contestable Proposal Success Rates



Type of Research

For IRANZ member organisations, the most significant type of research is applied research at 51 percent, with the remainder split between basic research at 25 percent and experimental development 24 percent.



Research Outputs

IRANZ member organisations have a focus on providing strategic, user-driven research and innovation. Research outputs include presentations, reports, industry sector publications, peer-reviewed publications, new processes or products, joint ventures, patents and licensing arrangements. IRANZ member organisations:

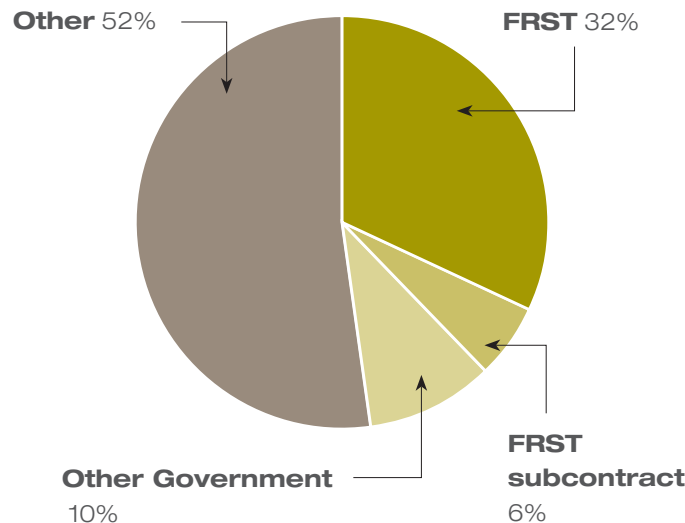
- Are independent

Research for New Zealand

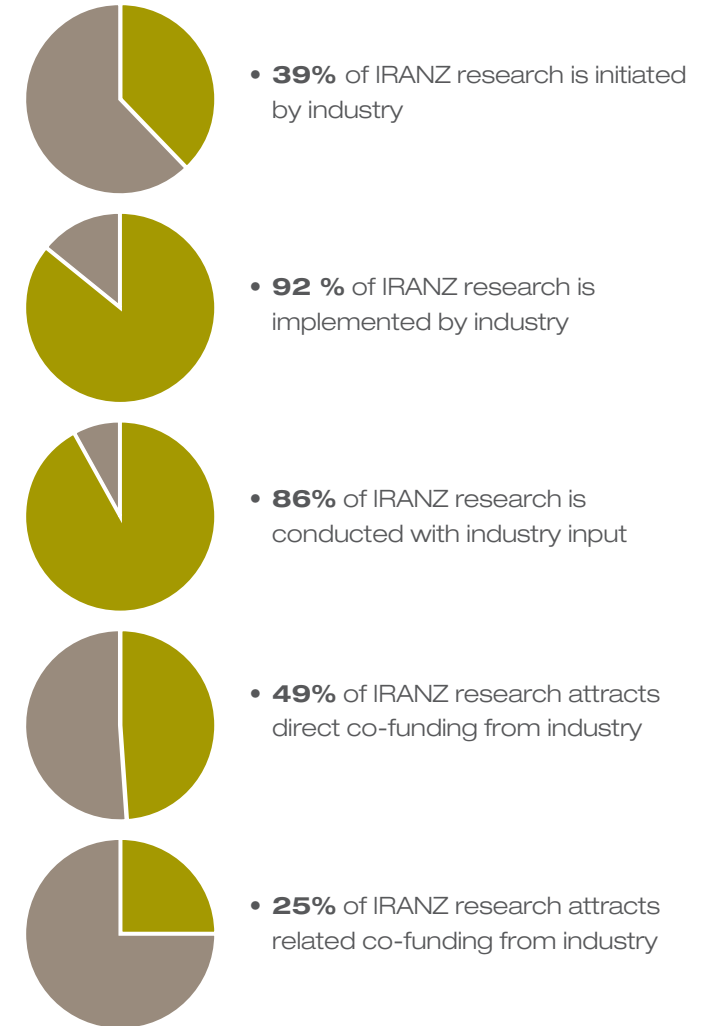
IRANZ member organisations provide over \$57 million of research for New Zealand and employ over 400 FTE staff. IRANZ organisations provide research training for over 30 postgraduate students.

On average, IRANZ member organisations get 48% of their revenue from government research contracts. This proportion of revenue for individual member organisations ranges from 10 to 83%. An average 38% of revenue for member organisations is from Foundation for Research, Science and Technology (FRST) contracts. This ranges from 7 to 73% for individual member organisations. On average, member organisations get 6% of their total revenue from FRST subcontracts whereby they are not the primary contract holder who negotiates with FRST.
